

Photocopying, Scanning and Digital Re-use under the terms of the Higher Education Licence

1 August 2008 - 31 July 2011

This institution holds a licence with The Copyright Licensing Agency Ltd (CLA) that permits the photocopying, scanning and re-use of limited extracts from copyright protected books, journals, magazines and other periodicals published in either print and/or electronic form (e.g. e books, e-journals).

Photocopying

Limits

The proportion of a work that may be photocopied consists of:

- one whole **chapter** from a book
 - one whole **article** from a journal issue
 - a **short story** or **poem** (not exceeding 10 pages in length) from an anthology
 - one whole **paper** from a set of conference proceedings
 - one whole **report** of a single case from a volume of judicial proceedings
- or 5% of any of the above, **whichever is the greater**

Territories

The material licensed for photocopying consists of books, journals, magazines and other periodicals published in the:

- United Kingdom and
- Argentina, Australia, Austria, Barbados, Belgium, Canada (including Quebec), Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Luxembourg, Mexico, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Taiwan (R.O.C.), Trinidad and Tobago and the United States of America (as also published on the CLA website under the heading '**International Territories**' and added to from time to time)

except those works listed in the '**List of Excluded Categories and Works**' (as published on the CLA website) and those works published by publishers listed in the '**List of Excluded US Publishers**' (as published on the CLA website)

Course of Study

Multiple photocopies must be distributed to registered students and members of staff with strict reference to a **Course of Study**; a Course of Study refers to any segment of a student's programme of study which, for the purpose of examination and/or assessment, is a discrete and self contained unit.

Scanning / Digital Re-use

The preparation and distribution of Digital Copies (whether produced by scanning or by copying of digital material) is subject to various restrictions and obligations; these are explained in detail in the User Guidelines (see below). One of the obligations is that the distribution of a Digital Copy must be authorised by a 'Designated Person' – a member of academic or administrative staff specially appointed to do so. Members of staff not appointed as a Designated Person and students are **not** permitted to scan under this licence. **If they should do so – and do not seek the written permission of the rightsowner – they may be putting themselves and this institution at risk of a claim for infringement of copyright law.** It is highly recommended that you contact your Licence Co-ordinator to enquire about arrangements to produce a Digital Copy under the terms of the licence.
